Riverbank Grants Scheme 2017-18

The City of Nedlands, in partnership with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, is undertaking a river foreshore restoration project at Point Resolution Reserve, after receiving \$24,920 from the department's Riverbank funding program. The project aims to increase biodiversity and improve habitat along the Swan River foreshore.

Coastwest Grant

In partnership with the Swanbourne Coastal Alliance, the City of Nedlands received \$21,237 through the WA Planning Commission's Coastwest Grants Program in October 2017. The rehabilitation project aims to restore degraded areas of Swanbourne's coastal dune system.
