## City to have Significant Tree Register

City of Nedlands Council this week voted in favour of establishing a Significant Tree Register for trees on Crown and road reserves and City owned land. Trees of significant age and size, or those with aesthetic, heritage, cultural or ecological importance may be considered for the register. Trees on private property may also be nominated for registration by the owner of the private land. More information available soon.

## Stage 1 - Brockway shared pathway nearing completion

The City is working with the Department of Transport on the construction of a 2.5m wide dual-use pathway within the southbound verge of Brockway Road between Underwood Avenue and Lemnos Street. Completion of the pathway is expected by end of May 2021.
