Shenton Bushland Quenda Release

Rangers will be actively patrolling Shenton Bushland for dogs not being on a lead. This is in response to a number of native Quendas (commonly known as Bandicoots), being released by the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions at Shenton Bushland in early May. Quendas are a rabbit-sized native Australian digging marsupial that play an important role in bushland health. **Dogs are required** to be on a lead in Shenton Bushland in accordance with the City's Dog Local Law. Visitors should also stay on the designated footpaths to assist with reducing bushland damage. More information can be found on the City's website or by contacting the Ranger team on 9273 3500.

Tree Vandalism Notice

The City of Nedlands has experienced incidents of wilful damage and poisoning of trees on public land. The City is committed in its efforts to fight against acts of this nature to public trees. Vandalism of public trees harms the local amenity and costs ratepayers thousands of dollars every year. It is an offence under the *Local Government Act 1995* for unauthorised persons to prune, remove or otherwise interfere with any tree which is under the care, control or management of the City.

There are substantial penalties for the unlawful destruction of vegetation. Vandalising the City's trees is an offence that will be dealt with through the courts. Where the act of interfering with a tree is wilful, and results in damage to the tree, the offender(s) if identified may be charged with criminal damage.

Detailed records are kept of the 22,000 plus public trees in the City of Nedlands. Where there is evidence a tree (or trees) has been wilfully damaged or removed, the City will replant and maintain trees in response to the act of vandalism. The City may also erect signage or take other measures to indicate to the community that a tree (or trees) has been poisoned, ring barked or cut down without lawful authority.

The City is known for its green and leafy suburbs and the City is committed to protecting the trees on land under its care and control. If you have information that may help to identify tree vandals, please contact the City on **9273 3500** or email **council@nedlands.wa.gov.au**
