Mayor's Message

Dear Residents,

I am honoured to be serving as your mayor for the next four years.

On the evening of October 23, 2023, I had the privilege of being sworn in as the 12th Mayor of the City of Nedlands. I am the only woman in the history of our city to be re-elected into this position. The last community leader to be popularly re-elected as mayor was David C. Cruickshank, who served from 1979 to 1992.

I stood for powerful fiscal management, sustainability, smart planning decisions, community representation, the support of local business as well as the arts, sports, medical and education.

Now I am re-elected, I will continue to conduct my role without fear or favour.

The election campaign was a family affair, with the help of our four children, my father, my husband, and even our dog, Mr Peter Miller, who was extremely keen to keep the converted title of 'Mayoral Mutt.' I also enrolled the services of some old and recent friends, as well as the wonderful, Ivan, from the Ukraine, who as many of you may know received a full boarding and tuition scholarship at Scotch College. We all delivered brochures in record heat. My father did the double up and had no idea what streets were covered! At one point Dad, lost Archibald, (our twelve-year-old son) in the middle of Mt Claremont. Fortunately, he was found soon after. Nevertheless, campaigning for Mum to win mayor, in the school holidays, will certainly be the memory of a lifetime for our family! Thank you to everyone, who helped me, and those who voted for me. I am extremely grateful.

My immediate priority is to push our council's state-first policy to protect trees on urban private land across the finish line. This is extremely important. Our environment is precious, and it is our responsibility to safeguard it for future generations.

Looking ahead, the biggest hurdle facing our City will be getting our finances back on track. We may be the wealthiest community in the state, yet our City is not a representation of our stakeholders. We have limited cash reserves, and without money, we lurch from annual budget to annual budget, with no room to move. This is my ongoing focus.

I encourage all people who live in our city, to come along and contribute, you are welcome to kindly volunteer your time for our community. This work can take on many forms, it may be an area of interest, it may have been a sector where you have worked, it may be a simple deputation to council, it may be a word of advice and it may lead to bigger things. We are all rate payers, so let us all be a part of this. If we are going to be the best, we must pull together.

To achieve this, I am looking for local heroes in fiscal management, sustainability, smart planning, community representation, sport, local business, arts, education and medical. <u>Please reach out to me</u> if these areas are of interest to you.

I look forward to meeting all of you. Be proud of where you live. We are all part of this unique city and I thank you for being part of our wonderful community.
