



Road Rehabilitation and Maintenance

• Alfred and Rochdale Road Intersection

Road, kerb and footpath upgrades requiring traffic management, are currently underway and will continue throughout July. Please consider alternative routes during this time as there will be delays and road closures.

• Portland Street

Road surface rehabilitation, drainage and gutter upgrades will require traffic management and short term road closures to all but local traffic, with short periods where no traffic will be allowed. Night works will be required at Portland Street/Stirling Hwy intersection early August. Further information will be provided to effected residences through letter drops.
