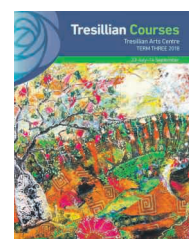

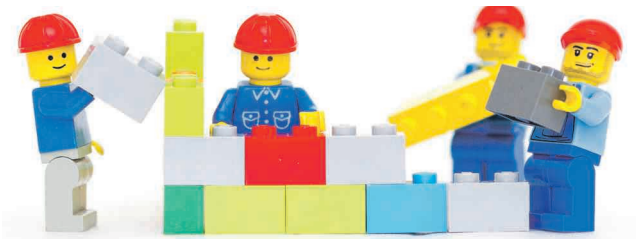
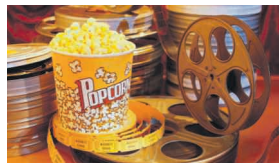
### Tresillian Arts Centre: enrolments open

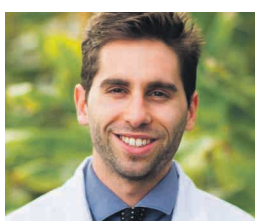
