Nedlands Community Care

A local, trusted community-based organisation, established in 1982 by residents and the City of Nedlands. Professional staff and volunteers work as a team to provide support services to allow seniors, and their carers to remain in their own home for as long as they wish.

Trained staff provide support with:

- Showering and dressing assistance
- Medication prompts/well-being checks
- Shopping with support staff or lists
- Light household duties and laundry
- Transport to medical appointments
- Light garden maintenance
- Shopping bus to local centres

Wheelchair-accessible transport is provided to and from the centre and to outings.
