## State-of-the-art upgrade for Waratah Avenue

Upgrades to Dalkeith's central business hub are well underway with improved road infrastructure including a Citygreen 'Stratavault' Structural Soil Vault system with specially constructed organic soil, designed to support and enrich urban landscaping.
